


TOPS club had a great time with about 65 ranchers watching a movie at Rainbow Acres. They served popcorn and candy, had about 25 TOPS members show up.

A very busy week, but not a lot of variety to share as teachers gave Quarter 2 tests. In Mr. Hansen's 6th grade Math class, students finished up final assignments and took their quarterly

benchmark test for Quarter 2. The second quarter covered how ratios and proportions can be a useful tool to solve all kinds of problems, from measurement conversions to percent problems. As they begin the third quarter, they will continue division with fractions and move into working with integers.

7th grade Math is wrapping up proportions and will be moving into consumer math including integers, taxes, discounts and interest. They will begin their JA Finance workbooks to prepare for a hands on PBL simulation in May. The workbooks include balancing checkbooks, mock W-2 forms and checks, where students determine the amount of taxes paid on earned income. Students will also learn about investments, debt and simple interest.

In 7th grade Science, they began their week by synthesizing identifying characteristics of igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rock structures. To complete the rock cycle, students will finish a 3D model of such structures and prepare for their mid-term assessment at the end of the week.

Mr. Wilson's seventh grade Social Studies classes made their assignments for their Civil War Poster Projects and started doing research on Wed. and Thurs. They will be completing the research and beginning to plan the posters and their presentations to finish by the middle of January. They were able to choose an individual, a battle, a topic or issue. When they finish, they will present them to the class.

All three grades of Title I Math reviewed the quarter's Math topics on Monday and Tuesday and took the 2nd Quarter examson Wednesday and Thursday. The 7th graders received the best test scores of the three classes, followed by the 6th graders and then 8th.


Mrs. Norman's Title I Reading classes finished up their novels this week. The 8th graders finished reading, "Hoot", and will watch the movie next week. They will then compare and contrast the movie and the book. The 7th graders finished reading, "My Side of the Mountain." They will continue watching the movie and compare and contrast next week as well. The 6th graders have already finished reading, "Riding Freedom." Unfortunately, there is not a movie that correlates with this novel. Instead, they will make friendship bracelets next week, as it relates to the events in the novel.

- I = Interpersonal skills
- P = Persistence
- O = Optimism
- S = Self-Awareness
- S = Self- Control
- E = Empathy
- S = Social Skills
- S = Self-Motivation

The class is breaking down each skill to get a deep understanding of what they mean and how the skill will help them to become a successful person.
