Weekly Board Report 11 October 2018

The overall enrollment of Camp Verde Unified School District is 1559 as compared 1612 one year ago. Current enrollment vs. same time last year: Elementary 651 vs.691: Middle School 365 vs. 382; Camp Verde High School 497 vs. 473: Accommodations School 20 vs. 31: South Verde High School 26 vs. 35.

Teachers who taught in Arizona in fiscal year 2017 and are teaching again this year are eligible for a 1.06% raise. At the time of this summer's budget adoption we estimated the number of teachers and their compensation. Now that the year has started we need to revise the number of teachers and their compensation amounts to our actual numbers. In this month's board meeting the board will be asked to approve a revised budget to reflect this change. The budget revision reflects a small increase in Maintenance and Operations.

At CVHS we are striving to increase the academic rigor at our school. We are including more vocabulary development in lessons for our students in our English and Social Studies classes. We recently brokered a deal with an assessment company which will allow us to give the Pre-ACT test to all of our students this year for free. This is in addition to the ACT which we give to all our 11th grade students at no cost. So you can see we are trying to improve our students' literacy skills as well as give them credible tests which provide valuable feedback which teachers and administrators can use to baseline our students. Then we can prepare plans for our students so we can help them grow academically. While the letter grade is just a letter, it does tell us some areas of weakness so we can plan accordingly.

For the last 8 years, Camp Verde Middle School has worked with local fire departments to teach hands only CPR to all of its students. Here are our 6th graders:

Volunteering/Community Service

- A beneficial event for our school and the community has included a monthly visit to the food bank where students help organize donations and package and hand out food.
- Mrs. Murphy is getting ready for our 9th annual spook house for Halloween. Every year Mrs. Murphy transforms our school into a haunted house for the community to enjoy. Hours are between 5:30 pm and 9:00 pm on October 31st.
- Last week, Mrs. Wilson organized CPR training for our students. The local fire department provided hands only CPR which certified our students for the next two years. Fire fighters from the fire department next door to our school attended at the same time making the experience extraordinary. Soon, they will allow us to walk through the fire station and learn about the life of a firefighter.

Science

 We have organized a science club where students participate in activities after school that is related to science. Currently, we are building a trebuchet for a pumpkin chucking contest at the fairgrounds in Cottonwood on October 28th.

- Just last week most of our students traveled to Scottsdale where they attended a Science Engineering Technology and Math (STEM) class on physics. The first half of their day was spent learning to measure and calculate the surface area of their body then use that data to calculate how much wind speed is required to lift them from the ground. During the last portion of the day, students tested their estimates in an actual wind tunnel used as a sky diving simulation. They suited up, entered the wind tunnel and were able to experience sky diving and record data. The data was analyzed by comparing the actual wind speed that lifted the students with the estimated wind speed they calculated earlier.

Math

- Math is going very well this year. Mr. Allred, who is an engineer and one of our paraprofessionals, has been a wonderful help in getting our students either caught up or on track. Our recent STEM visit to ifly has given our students the ability to make a meaningful connection to the math that is taught in class with the world they live within.
- Recently, Mr. Allred has set aside two hours per week to tutor students in math. Students are chosen based our observations of their understanding of math concepts. Our initial goal is to first offer the foundational skills needed to be successful in high school math.

English

- This week in English, Mrs. Zawel is making connections to other disciplines with English. Our first hour class is reading the Chocolate War by Robert Cormier. Its contents exemplify the harms of intimidation and students are exploring both public and private consequences.
- In 2nd hour, students are reading the Great Gatsby and 3rd hour is reading Frankenstein. As students delve deeper into Frankenstein, they connect their literature with research on multiple sciences such as stem cell research and genetic engineering.

Art

• This week in art, our students prepared images on mini canvases that are going to be displayed at the Cottonwood Fair this year. The works of art will be auctioned off and proceeds are donated to charity.

Leadership

• This year we have combined our career essentials class with leadership. Recently, students have been completing job applications, creating resumes and preparing speeches on topics such as ethics, values and goals. Soon, students will use their career portfolio to prepare for mock interviews with individuals from our community.

Growing Gardens

It has been a goal for a couple of years now to start an official garden program here at Camp Verde Elementary School. This year, we added a gardening club to our Friday camps. Mr. Lewy has worked with Gardens for Humanity for a long time, keeping a garden plot for his class in our upper elementary courtyard. This year, he agreed to run the gardening program and has expanded the number of garden beds. The club has also added bird feeders and a bird bath. In addition, students have asked for a butterfly garden. The goal is for each teacher to have a plot or a container for their class. They can design lessons that fold gardening into reading, math, and science classes.



Native American Day Performance

In honor of Native American Day, many students who are members of the Yavapai-Apache Nation presented a wonderful celebration filled with traditional music and dancing.
