Director of Business Services Mr. Hicks presented the proposed budget which has increased 6.4% from last year's budget, mostly due to the increase from the State for teacher salaries. Seventy six percent of the budget is going to salaries with an additional nineteen percent funding salaries from grants. Without the grants ninety eight percent of the budget would be allocated to salaries only.

Requirements, Training and Responsibility, along with Policy Regulation and Exhibit Mr. Howe explained the recommended policy and regulation amendments were in order to help hold incoming bus drivers accountable for training received on the district's dime and retain them for at least one year.

Mrs. German asked to look into bus drivers paying a deposit for training and then receiving the return once they completed a year of work. Mr. Howe will look into this prior to the second reading of the policy.
